We have also had a 'Meet The Professionals' career event which again gave students the opportunity to consider a wide range of professions.



It was a positive visit over all with almost all girls gaining insight into some career they might wish to pursue.










A group of Year 9 pupils attended a launch event, exclusively for JLR Partner Schools.

MYA run the programme across Liverpool high schools where they help young people to understand ways to prevent violence whilst remaining safe.

MVP has been delivered in Holly Lodge for the past 3 years and is very successful.

This year we have 40 year 10 mentors supporting our younger pupils.

In order for us to support our young people properly, year 7 students can complete a survey that was sent to parents/carers earlier this year highlighting the areas they may be struggling to understand or manage. This helps us to ensure that these areas are tackled during the sessions.

World Book Day on 7th March this year went off with a bang!


Staff and students worked really hard decorating doors to represent their favourite books.

### FOOD FOR THOUGHT - HOLLY LODGE FOOD DIGNITY PANTRY

National data on food insecurity shows that 9.3 million adults (17.7% of households) experienced food insecurity in January 2023, and with one in four households with children, that's around four million children experiencing food insecurity in that same month.

The Trussell Trust states, that the London regions had the highest distribution of Trussell Trust food parcels in 2021 /22, closely followed by the North -West.

Holly Lodge have been working with MCKS Charitable Foundation for 3 years so far and have provided families and the community with dignity hampers and toiletries.

In total Holly Lodge have provided over 400 dignity hampers to families within our community so far.

At Christmas, Holly Lodge staff work alongside MCKS making donations so that we are able to put Christmas Hampers together with some festive treats in each hamper!

This year we are hoping to help around 30 families with our festive dignity hampers.
